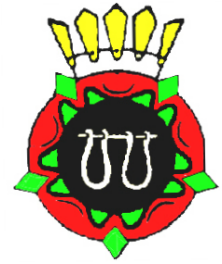

REGENT PARK GOLF CLUB Ltd

The club was established in 1932 and is one of the 13 clubs affiliated to the Bolton Golf Association.

COURTESY

As a matter of courtesy, it is customary to greet the President, Captain, Vice President, Vice Captain, Secretary, BGA and Captains Society dignitaries with a "Good Morning/Afternoon etc Mr ...". This is just for the first time in the day. Afterwards, normal names can be used.

DRESS CODE

The Club maintains normal Golf Club standards. Smart, clean casual wear on the course or in the clubhouse at all times with certain exceptions when formal dress must be worn.

Jeans, track-suits, trainers and collarless shirts are not permitted on the course or in the clubhouse- whether playing with members or non- members. Waterproof clothing or soiled clothing is not permitted in the clubhouse.

ETIQUETTE

Course Normal golf etiquette is expected on the course at all times, including replacing divots, raking bunkers, repairing pitch marks on a green, avoiding slow play and allowing players to play through when you are searching for a lost ball.

Clubhouse Members should conduct themselves appropriately with card games, language should be discreet (particularly when Ladies are present) and voices must not be raised excessively.

MEMBERSHIP

All members are welcome to avail themselves of the clubhouse facilities at any time, subject to private functions being held.

There are three groups of male members in the club – Full, 5 Day and Junior.

Full membership allows participation in club competitions during the weekend and weekdays during summer months.

5 Day membership allows participation in competitions during the week only.

Junior membership allows for junior competitions only, usually played on Sunday afternoons. Juniors can be offered a Senior membership when either aged over 16 or with a handicap of 12 or less on payment of a Full membership.

Membership also provides members with an official CONGU handicap acceptable at all recognised clubs. Certificates can be obtained on request from the clubs Competitions and Handicap Secretary.

HANDICAPS/COMPETITIONS

To obtain a handicap, a new or lapsed member must submit three cards marked by a current member these are to be marked 'for Handicap Purposes' and must be played for the competition Tees (White).

Once a member has been given a handicap or one has been transferred from another club, this will allow new members to play in all competitions.

A new member can not win a **Board or Major Competition** within the first 12 months of joining the club.

Full and Junior membership of the club also gives opportunities to play in BGA and other competitions – details of these will be posted on the notice boards. Full and Junior members can also play in League and Cup Team matches for the club.

SOCIALS

Social events are regularly organised by the club and members are requested to attend as many as possible. These include Presentations, Quiz Nights, Party Nights, Race Nights and Mixed Dinners, etc.

The Major events in the clubs social calendar are the Captains Dinner, held usually on the second Saturday in February, and Major Prize Presentation towards the end of November.
